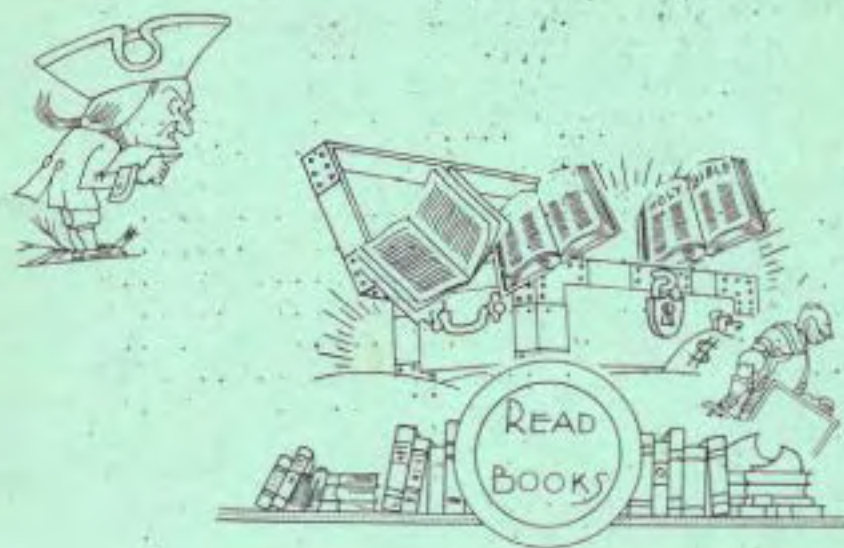

IRISH REPUBLIC RECORDS con't:

The public Record Office, Four Courts, Dublin 7, Irish Republic contains what is left of Irish Wills and parish registers but most of these were destroyed when the previous Record Office was destroyed by fire in 1922. However, parish registers do not go back very far because few of the clergy kept registers before 1800.

British subjects abroad,
Army and Royal Air Force records

The Registrar General at St. Catherines House, 10 Kingsway, London WC2B 6JP, England also has records of births, marriages and deaths kept by British Consuls since 1849 in respect of British subjects abroad and similar extracts from Army records (personnel and families) some of which date back to 1761. Royal Air Force returns are available. These return commence in 1920. When enquiring it is necessary to state the name, precise date and place of occurrence and in the case of Army or Royal Air Force records, the regiment or unit.

The Actual registers of births, marriages and deaths at the various record offices are not open to inspection but at St. Catherines House in London, index books may be searched by anyone at will and free of charge. This can save initial time and expense (assuming one is so fortunate to be visiting London in the first place!!). The search rooms in London are open to the public from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday (closed Public Holidays) and in the summer months they can become very crowded. An early start is therefore recommended!

The information from the registers is supplied in the form of certified copies of entries which can normally be issued within 48 hours if applied for in person, or 7 to 10 days if handled by mail. If writing from the United States, you should always enclose a self-addressed envelope for reply and send post office reply coupons to cover postage (extra coupons if you want an airmiled reply since surface mail from the U.K. takes from 3 to 4 weeks).

Forgetting her own trials and sorrows, she sought her weeping and sorrowing friends whose homes had been made desolate by the ravages of War.....

Noah Smithwick, in The Evolution of a State gives details of the arrangement of the wedding of a couple. The Alcalde tied the knot in good American style but the contracting parties had, in addition, to sign a bond to avail themselves of the Priest's services to legalize the wedding at the earliest opportunity.

One aim of the Mexican government was to convert the colonists to their Catholic faith. The priest designated to a domain made periodic visits during which he performed marriages that had been consummated by adalades, and christened children long since born. When married by the adalades, the bride and groom had to sign a bond promising to have the Holy Rites performed during the next visit of the priest.

So, it would seem that an excellent way to look for Texas ancestors might be through the Catholic Records.

HEAD OVER HEELS IN LOVE

On Box Hill, Surrey just south of London, England there stands a sad and lonely monument to an eccentric British Officer. Major Peter Labelliere, of French descent, served in the American War of Independence in the Duke of Devonshire's Regiment, and on his retirement met and fell in love with the daughter of a country parson from Cornwall. Unrequited love soured him into a moody, bitter eccentric. He took lodgings near Box Hill, where he spent hours daily trying to walk out his depression. It was during one such walk that he fell and lost one eye. Sometimes he disappeared from his lodgings for weeks at a time. On a September evening in 1799, he returned from one such excursion and announced that in nine months' time he would die at exactly 4 p.m. Nine months to the day, he died--at 4 p.m. His last request was to be buried vertically, head down, on his beloved Box Hi... 'As the world was turned topsy-turvey, it's only fitting, that I should be buried so'.

My old uncle, he old, old man, had a fire and he was roastin' two pomegranates for me and sis Rebecca. He say, 'Now, ma dey is right. Dey is done been hearin' a voice--dat de evil voice. Now let me tell you how to get rid dat old evil spirit. Jest don't pay him no attention. Dat make him mad and he go away. Next time he call, just stand dar and laugh, and say..."We know you, we ain't a comin'" Well sometimes we don't hear dat voice for three days. Dat eveil spirit smar. He try to fool us. Den de call. We start to follow but sister remember, so we stand up and most bust our sides laughin'/ And he stop, but he tricky. He wait a month and den he call again, but we jes laugh. Den dat spirit get real mad, and we hear de bruch jes a moanin' and a cryin' and a callin', but we don't follow. Den ders a loud noise like somebody a runnin' through de brush, and we never hear dat spirit again."

(From old Bible of JOHN BEGGS RAULERSON, in possession, in 1939, of his grandson, Samuel Leonard Raulerson, of Socrum, Polk County, Florida. This old Bible is large and falling to pieces - entire back and fly leaves gone. In the center next to the family record is a page showing: "The New Testament of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, translated out of the original Greek; and with the Former Translations Diligently Compared and Revised;" - also "Account of the Dates or Time of Writing of Books of the New Testament." No date or the name of the publisher is found. These records taken off by Lillian Carpenter on June 8, 1939.)
